LESSON FIVE - The Law

Part I - The Conscience of Man

THE BOOK OF THE LAW

The term "**the Law**" is used to refer to the book of divine instructions given directly by God to Moses for the nation of Israel, it is also referred to as the **Mosaic Law**. Sometimes the first five books of the Bible (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy) are collectively called the "*Book of the Law*." Moses was the human instrument God used to write this portion of Scripture, which is also referred to as the **Pentateuch**, which is made up of two Greek words, *pente* (five) and *teuche* (scroll) and means five fifths of the Law (literally five-volume book).

Historically, this portion of Scripture covers the period of time from the creation of the world until the death of Moses shortly before Israel actually entered into Canaan. Genesis 1-11 tells us of the creation, man's fall into sin, the first promise of redemption (Gen. 3:15), the judgment of the world by flood during the time of Noah, and the tower of Babel which resulted in the confusion of tongues and the dispersion of the nations. Chapters 12-50 brings a narrowing of focus that plays an important part in God's eternal plan for the creation and mankind. This portion of the Pentateuch deals particularly with the history of Abraham and his descendants through his son, Isaac, and grandson, Jacob, who became the nation of Israel under the God-given leadership of Moses.

An Important History

To come to a proper understanding of why God ushered in the Dispensation (administration), of the Law through Moses, it is imperative that we understand some of the events leading to this history changing event.

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In the Garden

During their brief stay in the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve had but one rule or law; *“But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil thou shalt not eat of it: for in that day thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die”* (Gen. 2:17). But, in disobedience, they did eat and became sinners. No longer did they have a relationship with God, but were now separated from Him and under the curse of sin.

The Conscience of Man

Along with being ejected from the Garden came the initiation of the blood sacrifice as an offering to God on behalf of the sinner. Man now had the knowledge of good and evil, human conscience had come into being. Man would be held responsible for his response to the Law of the Conscience which had been written in the heart of man. Romans 1:16-2:16 tells us more in regard to this issue.

They Know

*“Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God has shewed it unto them. For the invisible things of Him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead: so they are without excuse” (Rom. 1:19-20). Man, in his foolishness, denies God and His authority over all of the creation, including mankind, and so brings condemnation and judgment upon himself. To deny God, a man or woman must deny the evidence that is found everywhere in nature that God is indeed the Creator of all things. Indeed, he or she must deny what they know in their innermost being to be true. This is a violation of the conscience; it is sin. Romans 1:24-32 explains that man has been given over to practice all sorts of evil *“because that, when they knew God, they glorified Him not as God, neither were thankful... and even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind...” (Vs. 21, 28). Following a list of wicked acts that are performed by men and women (vs. 29-31), verse 32 explicitly states that “who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them.” Yes, mankind instinctively knows good and evil; that there is right and wrong, and that there are dire consequences, but man chooses to do that which is evil.**

Romans 2:14-15 goes on to tell us that *“when the Gentiles which have not the law, do by nature the things contained in the law, these, having not the law, are a law unto themselves; which shew the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience also bearing witness, and their thoughts the meanwhile accusing or else excusing one another.”* The fact that man makes rules and laws of order to govern society proves that he has the capability of recognizing right from wrong. He also has the ability to deny what he (or she) knows to be true in order to believe the lie.

Just as the drug or alcohol addict will deny that he or she has a problem as an excuse to continue on in their destructive habit, so does the majority of the human race deny that they have a sin problem in order to reject the fact that they must one day give an account to God for their actions.

What is popularly called “denial” in our culture is simply called “unbelief” in the Bible. Let us never forget that sin is not only the doing of certain vile acts, but is also found in the secret places of the heart. It is not the amount of sin that separates man from God, but the fact of sin. In God's eyes, all sin is a violation of His Holiness.

Man's Failure

Just as Adam failed in the Garden of Eden, his descendants failed in the centuries that followed. As the human race multiplied over the face of the earth, so did sin. The wickedness of man became great in the earth and every intent of the thoughts of the heart of man was continually on doing evil (see Gen. 6:1-5). *“The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence”* (Gen. 6:11). Man failed to continue in righteousness just as Adam failed to obey God in the Garden. The murder of his brother Abel by Cain was a foreshadowing of the evil that would control the earth as the population grew. The only authority man recognized was “self” as the collective heart of man hardened itself against its God-given conscience and so against God Himself.

Anarchy Ruled

The implication is that each man was doing what was right in his own eyes. In other words, whatever they thought they could get away with, they did. There was no central government of any kind, hence no government courts, police, armies, etc. etc. to protect the general populace. Wickedness of all sorts was rampant.

JUDGMENT FINALLY COMES

Genesis 6:1-8:22

The long-suffering of God had come to an end, righteousness would prevail, justice would be served. Except for Noah and his wife, their three son's and their wives, the whole world would be destroyed by a great flood. God commissioned Noah to build an ark in which he, his family, and male and female animals from each species were able to survive the Great Flood.

They Were Warned

Noah was a preacher of righteousness, who not only built an ark for the saving of his family, but for a period of 120 years sounded a warning to the world (Gen. 6:3; Heb. 11:7). A warning that fell on deaf ears (I Pet. 3:20). Ears deafened by their own sin hardened hearts (II Pet. 2:5).

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AFTER THE FLOOD

Genesis 9:1-7

The world that Noah and his family found after the waters of the flood had receded was vastly different from what they had known before. Not only was the climate and landscape forever changed, but also man's relationship to animals was changed. In the pre-flood world there was no rain, but a mist came up from the ground (Gen. 2:6). This indicates that the entire world was probably tropical in climate. But Noah and his descendants would experience more pronounced seasons, just as we do to this day (Gen. 8:22). In addition, the animals began to fear man who was no longer a vegetarian, but would now eat the flesh of animals.

Human Government

The most remarkable change though was the institution of human government by a divine decree of God. Mankind had proven itself unable to maintain order or to refrain from evil. Left to his conscience alone, man had filled the earth with so much wickedness and violence that God was compelled to destroy the whole world. Now, added to the Law of Conscience was Human Government as a means of checks and balances against the wickedness of men. God promised to never destroy the world by flood again, but He did not say that He would cease to judge sin.

After leaving the ark and offering burnt offerings (blood sacrifices), Noah and his sons received a new responsibility. By a directly given commission from God, they were told that "whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed; for in the image of God made

he man" (Gen. 9:6). This was a charge to maintain peace on earth, by force if necessary. This inauguration of human government upon the earth prepared the way for civil government to rule over the general populace as a barrier against unbridled evil.

With the introduction of human government, man's approach to God had not changed nor was man's conscience in abeyance. In fact, the opposite was true. With the threat of immediate legal reprisal for his evil from a human source, man would be more apt to listen to the voice of his conscience, if not from the heart then at least out of fear of being caught. One dispensation had not ended and another begun, but a new dispensational dimension had been added, a dimension which would continue throughout human history.

Our Response

In times past, as now, a proper response to one's conscience is to acknowledge the truth that man is a sinner. While the degree or extent of willful transgression against our God-given consciences may not be the same, the fact remains that every son and daughter of Adam has willfully done what they knew was wrong. What we know about ourselves is enough to confirm in our own hearts the truth of Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." God simply asks that we acknowledge this fact and put our trust in Christ alone to be redeemed from the awful curse of sin. We are not to offer burnt sacrifices on an altar as in past dispensations, but to trust in Jesus Christ as the final sacrifice for sin whose death was sufficient to save all who come to Him "in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace" (Eph. 1:7).



He became very specific and graphic in dealing with Judah's sins, as he confronted them with being guilty of murder, taking advantage of widows and orphans, drunkenness, liars, haters of good, and idolatry (Isa. 1:15; 10:1,2; 28:7,8; 30:8-11; 44:14-17).

Isaiah then proceeds to contrast the foolishness and folly of idolatry with the greatness of the One True Living God, which is why we find all those wonderful
