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## RIGHTLY DIVIDING THE WORD OF TRUTH

### LESSON THIRTEEN—The Lord Jesus Christ—Part III

#### *A Secret Revealed*

With Israel having rejected her Messiah, "the time of Jacob's trouble" (Jer. 30:7) was imminent. This would be a time of purging, a cleansing of Israel, and the judgment of the nations, a time called the Great Tribulation. This would be a time of great adversity, affliction, anguish, and distress. The "great and terrible Day of the Lord" was at hand in accordance with the prophecies of the Old Testament. It was part of the already revealed purpose and plan for Israel and the nations. Christ would return to earth to reign over the world from Jerusalem, with Israel the favored nation through which the Gentiles would be blessed.

But God had another plan, which He had never revealed through the prophets or the Holy Scriptures. Up to this point in time it had been kept an absolute secret. It was a mystery program, of which not one hint had ever been given up to this point. It was a plan that had been formulated "before the foundation of the world" (Eph. 1:4). But now the magnificent Grace of God would be revealed. The secret (mystery) would no longer be kept, but was now to be openly and boldly proclaimed.

#### **The Chosen Messenger**

At the stoning of Stephen was a young man named Saul (see Acts 7:54-60), who was "consenting" to Stephen's death (Acts 8:1). In other words he put his stamp of approval on this terrible deed. He was in complete agreement with those who murdered this man of God. That he watched over their coats while they stoned Stephen (Acts 7:58) tells us that he was encouraging them to kill him.

But Saul was not content with the mere stoning of Stephen. No, he set about to destroy Christ's Church on earth (Acts 8:3; Gal. 1:13). Openly proclaiming threats of death, Saul petitioned the high priest for letters of authority to go to Damascus and arrest any of the Lord's disciples he found there (Acts 9:1-2). This man would meet the Lord of Glory Himself on the road to Damascus. Jesus Christ, the resurrected, ascended, and glorified Son of God, personally chose Saul to be His messenger of Grace. To him He would reveal the marvelous mystery of "the dispensation of the grace of God" (Eph. 3:2).

Up until this point in time any blessings received by the Gentiles were channeled through Israel, the nation of God's covenants and promises concerning the coming of God's Kingdom to earth. One day the Kingdom will come, but not before the Dispensation of Grace runs its course. Interrupting the prophetic Kingdom Program to usher in the Dispensation of Grace, the Lord chose to reveal this new program through Saul of Tarsus, the leader of the rebellion against Him. This man, who thought he was pleasing God by persecuting the disciples of Jesus Christ, would now become Christ's appointed ambassador to proclaim salvation to Jew and Gentile alike without national distinction. With Israel temporarily set aside in unbelief, God would now deal with mankind on a personal level rather than on a national basis. Saul, who became the Apostle Paul, was uniquely the recipient, guardian and dispenser of the message of God's Grace. He was given the office of the Apostle to the Gentiles, or nations (Rom. 11:13).

### **The Details of the Message**

Salvation in the Dispensation of Grace is offered totally apart from any works, ordinances, or religious ritual. The only requirement is to believe (trust in, depend on) on Jesus Christ for forgiveness of sins. Having believed, the sinner becomes part of something new, something not mentioned or promised in the Covenants of Promise made with Israel. The believer becomes a member of the Church referred to as the Body of Christ (see Eph. 1:22-23). This Church is not the same as the Kingdom Church found in the writings of the Old Testament prophets, nor is it found in the Gospel accounts of Jesus Christ's earthly ministry, nor is it in the preaching or writings of Christ's Kingdom apostles (Peter and the eleven). This new truth, revealed to Paul by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, was a **secret now made known**. A new dispensation had begun and Paul was to be the one to announce it.

### **The Believer's Position**

When someone believes the Gospel of Christ, that individual is personally identified (baptized), with Jesus Christ; "for by one spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit" (I Cor. 12:13). This baptism, which actually unites the believer with Christ, is the "one baptism" of Ephesians 4:5 and the same as the baptism spoken of in Romans; "Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into His death? Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:3,4). Only the Holy Spirit of God can unite the believer with Christ and impart spiritual life. No water ritual could ever do this. This wonderful passage of Holy Scripture is not speaking of symbolism or the witness of any ritual carried out by man, but the spiritual reality of the believer becoming a partaker of Jesus Christ's death, burial, and resurrection by grace through faith in Him alone. Positionally the believer is **in Christ** and **with Christ**; "Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us (made us alive) together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) and hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus" (Eph. 2:5-6).

### **The Living Head**

Jesus Christ, the crucified, buried, resurrected, ascended, and glorified Son of God not only revealed to Paul the mystery of the Dispensation of Grace and its Church, the Body of Christ, He also revealed Himself to be the Head of the Body, which is made up of both Jew and Gentile without distinction (see Rom. 1:16; I Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:26-28; Eph. 2:11-16; Col. 3:9-11). This glorious truth was never before made known to man. The Old Testament prophets foresaw the coming of Israel's Messiah, and during His earthly ministry the Lord Jesus presented Himself as the One Israel was waiting for, indeed the One written about in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms (see Lk. 24:44). But not one word is to be found concerning Jesus Christ as the Head of the Church which is His Body that is seated with Him in heavenly places. Israel's prophetic hope was, and is, and always will be a Kingdom on earth. The hope of the Body of Christ is, and always will be, in heaven. The Kingdom Church and the Body of Christ are two distinct groups of God's people. While Jesus Christ is the common denominator that links these two groups, their relationship to Him is

distinctively different. To Israel He is the Messiah, the Mighty Priest-King who will one day set up His Everlasting Kingdom on earth. A Kingdom in which redeemed Israel will be the premier nation of all the nations of the earth. A nation of great honor, glory, physical and spiritual blessings. A nation of kings and priests (see Ex. 19:1-6; Jer. 31:23-40).

But the hope of the Church, which is Christ's Body, is heavenly in all its scope. Our future is not in Messiah's Kingdom on earth, but to rule and reign in Christ's stead in heavenly places throughout eternity. Both Churches extend into eternity when there will be a new heaven and a new earth and each will continue in their respective sphere of eternal blessing. *"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ"* (Eph. 1:3). *"And He is before all things, and by Him all things consist: And He is the Head of the Body, the Church: who is the beginning, the first born from the dead; that in all things He might have the preeminence."* (Col. 1:17-18).

### A Pure Message

Nowhere in the Bible do we find the Lord Jesus Christ more highly exalted than in Paul's letters. He lifts up and points to the Lord Jesus as the only hope for mankind and the only channel by which man may find peace with God. He presents Him not only as God having come in the flesh, the Creator taking on the form of His creation, but also as the crucified and resurrected One who sits in glory at the right hand of the Father (see Eph. 1:15-23; 3:9; Col. 1:16-18). He is the Son of God, He is the *"One Mediator between God and man, the Man Christ Jesus"* (I Tim. 1:4).

While it is true that Jesus Christ is the premier subject of the entire Bible, and that He is the only Savior of souls presented in the Scriptures, it is only in this present Dispensation of Grace that salvation through simple faith alone is offered. This offer is presented, without reservation or regard to national heritage, to both Jew and Gentile. This unique offer is only found in that portion of Holy Scripture that the Living Head of the Church, Jesus Christ Himself, has given to us through His own chosen Apostle, Paul. Therefore, if we are going to know all that the Lord wants us to know about Him and His purpose for us in the Dispensation of Grace, we must read and study and believe what has been written by Paul, through divine revelation, and providentially preserved for us in that wonderful Book we call the Bible, which is in fact the Word of God.



# *Courses Offered for the Spring 2004 Semester*

January 26-May 20, 2004

*(Mid-Semester Break—March 19th-28th)*

**102 - APOLOGETICS:** *(Two credit hours)* Apologetics is a defense of the origin and absolute reliability of the Bible as a Book uniquely inspired by God. This course offers a comprehensive and systematic survey of the evidences of the truth and authority of the Scriptures. It will help to confirm the students faith and equip him or her to stand against the attacks of humanistic unbelief, to be knowledgeable in order to effectively witness in our high-tech and evolutionary thinking culture, and to maintain a strong and uncompromising stand for the infallibility of God and His Word in every situation. This course is especially recommended for those attending or planning to attend a secular college or university.

**104 - BIBLE EXPOSITION II:** *(Four credit hours)* This course begins with Joshua and moves through II Chronicles giving the student a working knowledge of the history of Israel as a nation in the Promised Land. The special purpose of God's chosen people, the establishment of the Kingdom under David, the apostasy of Israel, the prophets God sent to Israel, the Babylonian Captivity, and how these things relate to the Millennial Kingdom and the present Dispensation of Grace is emphasized.

**106 - BASIC BIBLE DOCTRINES II:** *(Two credit hours)* A concise study of the important major doctrines of Scripture from a dispensational point of view. This course covers the Gifts, the Believers Walk, Baptism, the Lord's Supper, the Resurrection, the Second Coming of Christ, the State of the Dead, and the Mission and Commission of the Church.

**108 - ROMANS:** *(Two credit hours)* This course systematically works through the important epistle of the Apostle Paul to the Romans. The study of this book is vital to the understanding of man's universal need of salvation, God's provision of salvation through Jesus Christ, God's offer of salvation by faith alone, the dispensational nature of the Bible, God's dealings with Israel, and living the Christian life by faith.

**110 - ACTS:** *(Two credit hours)* This course is an expositional study of the book of Acts with special emphasis given to the importance of its historical aspects concerning the beginning of the Church (the Body of Christ), the dispensational transition into Grace, and their harmonization with the epistles of the Apostle Paul.

**112 - CULTS:** *(Two credit hours)* This course gives special attention to the distinctive errors that characterize the religious systems of the cults. The main emphasis is given to the true message of God's Word enabling the student to recognize erroneous teachings whenever and wherever they are encountered. An overview of the beliefs of the major cults in America and how to reach individuals caught in the spiritual darkness of a cult or false religious system with the message of God's Grace in Jesus Christ is also given.

**116 - BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW:** *(One credit hour)* The major worldviews are compared and contrasted with Biblical Christianity. This study shows how non-Christian values and belief systems have negatively influenced the thinking of our times. The incredible clarity, coherence, and truthfulness of the true Christian world-view is highlighted and affirmed.

**202 - CHRISTIAN EDUCATION I:** (*Two credit hours*) This course provides a general overview of the purposes, principles, and practices of Christian education within the local church. This course covers the history of Christian education and the importance of developing effective educational ministries in the local church. The content and methods of Christian education is dealt with.

**204 - BIBLE EXPOSITION IV:** (*Four credit hours*) This course is a survey of all of the Pauline epistles with special attention given to the purpose and doctrine of each in the context of Paul's ministry as the Apostle of the Gentiles who was especially commissioned to make known the Dispensation of the Grace of God (also offered is a more in-depth study of Romans and a systematic comprehensive review of Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians as separate courses).

**206 - DISPENSATIONAL THEOLOGY II:** (*Two credit hours*) Systematic Theology is the ordered study of the great doctrines of God's Word, the Bible. Dispensational Theology is the systematic in-depth study of the great doctrines of Scripture according to the Biblical principle of right division (II Tim. 2:15). The doctrines of the works of God (creation), Angelology (the nature and activities of angels); Anthropology (doctrine of man, his creation, nature and fall).

**208 - THE MINOR PROPHETS:** (*Two credit hours*) This course is a survey of the twelve Minor Prophets (Hosea-Malachi). Attention is given to the background, life, and major focus of the message of each of these prophets of God. Special interest is applied to the dispensational importance of their pre-millennial messianic themes.

**210 - HOMILETICS II:** (*Two credit hours*) How to study for, prepare, and deliver sound and relevant messages from God's Word. This course teaches the Biblical approach to studying, preparing and the delivering of topical, textual, and expository sermons. The student will examine the different types of sermons and will be expected to develop and present messages of each kind before a live audience.

**212 - CHURCH HISTORY:** (*Two credit hours*) An overview study of the major events affecting the Church from the time of the Apostle Paul to the present. A knowledge of Church History is essential to understanding the doctrinal and practical issues that led to the formation of the various denominations and other groups that exist today.

**214 - YOUTH MINISTRY:** (*One credit hour*) This class focuses on the basic principles of conducting youth work in the local church setting. Effective methods of youth ministry, Biblical counseling, activities, soul-winning, and camp will be covered.

**1002 - BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES OF MARRIED LIFE:** (*Two credit hours*) This semester, **BBI** is offering a special class on the Biblical principles of marriage. With the institution of marriage under assault because of the increasingly secularist/humanistic worldview that has permeated our society, it is vitally important that those who want a secure marriage understand the Biblical principles of marriage, and how to apply them in their own relationship. The roles and responsibilities of husbands, wives, and couples as well as how to solve the most difficult problems of married life will be covered. Participants are not required to make the normal formal application to take this special class. However, they must sign up by the 23rd of January if they plan to attend. Class size is restricted, so those who are interested are encouraged to sign up for the class as soon as possible. Single people are allowed to attend. Married couples are strongly urged to attend together if at all possible.
