### THE INSTITUTE UPDATE

Perhaps you have heard about some of the sad statistics that have come out of surveys taken within the evangelical Christian community. The reports that I have heard say that 1 out of every 3 Americans who claim to be "born-again" Christians believe that Jesus Christ actually committed sin during His life on earth. They also do not believe that He was physically resurrected from the dead or that faith in Christ is needed to go to heaven. It is also reported that an alarming number of professing Christians do not believe in the inerrancy of the Bible, and that there is a rapidly growing number who reject the idea of absolute truth in favor of a mystical approach to religion. These are just a few of the trends that are developing within "Christendom" today. It seems that there is a growing departure from the faith that has been taking place over the last two decades or so that is now starting to snowball.

When we look at what is taking place in America today, it seems obvious that a major part of the problem is that there are a lot of people who

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## *Rightly Dividing the Word of Truth*

### THE KINGDOM EPISTLES

Here we want to take a brief look at the New Testament Bible books of Hebrews, James, I & II Peter, I, II & III John, and Jude. These eight epistles have traditionally been referred to as the "General Epistles" to distinguish them from the 13 letters written by the Apostle Paul. We are aware that, for various reasons, many do not consider Hebrews as one of the General Epistles. However, because of the anonymity of its original recipients and its content, we are considering it with the General Epistles here. This is so because all of Paul's letters are addressed to a particular church, churches, or individuals. In contrast, these letters are usually considered to be addressed to "Christians in general," hence the term "General Epistles" has been assigned to them. Another term that is sometimes applied to them is "Catholic Epistles," which refers to them being universal in nature.

We concur that these books were originally letters written to the believers, or the Church, in general. But *which* Church is being addressed, and *why* these letters were written is another matter. As Dr. C.I. Scofield so aptly, and correctly, put it; "In his (Paul's) writings alone we find the doctrine, position, walk, and destiny of the church" (note on Ephesians 3:6, The Scofield Reference Bible, Oxford University Press, 1945, pg. 1252). Of course, this refers to the "*Church which is His (Christ's) Body*" (Eph. 1:22-23), the Church of the present Dispensation of Grace. But, if it is only in Paul's letters that we find reference to the Church of today and the particular doctrines that pertain to it, we must ask what doctrines do we find in the so-called

General Epistles, and who were they written specifically to and about? If these letters are going to be properly understood and applied in the life of the believer today, these questions must be correctly answered. Because we believe that the subject matter found in these epistles has direct application to the Church of the "last days," which will endure the Great Tribulation as they wait for Jesus Christ to return to establish His Kingdom on earth, we prefer to designate them as the "Kingdom Epistles."

THE KINGDOM CHURCH

Before going on we want to make it clear that we believe that the entire Bible is the Word of God, and that it is all for our learning and use. However, at the same time, we do not believe that it was all written to or about those living in the present Dispensation of Grace. Just as we find the doctrine, position, walk, and destiny of the Body of Christ proclaimed in the Apostle Paul's letters, we believe that things particular to the Kingdom Church are proclaimed and explained in Hebrews through Jude.


Sometimes these letters are referred to as the *Hebrew* or *Circumcision* Epistles because of their unmistakable Jewish overtones. It is obvious, even to the casual reader, that while there are similarities to Paul's letters in these books, there are also many differences, differences with a strong Hebrew flavor. Some of these differences are so strong that they appear as glaring contradictions that many good men have struggled with over the centuries. But, if these letters are approached as not being written to or about the same Church that Paul wrote to and about, the supposed contradictions are resolved and the confusion as to how they are to be applied today disappears.

The problem that has caused confusion in the Church for centuries is that most have never realized that God has two programs with two distinct Churches. One is the Body of Christ of the present Dispensation of Grace, which is made up of both Jews and Gentiles without any distinction at all between the two. This Church had its beginning with the conversion of the Apostle Paul (Acts 9:1-16), to whom the Lord revealed the "mystery of the Dispensation of Grace" (Eph. 3:1-9) that we are now living in. This came about after Israel's blatant rejection of the Lord Jesus as her promised Messiah at the stoning of Stephen (Acts 7:51-60).

Those Jews who did believe that the Lord Jesus was indeed the promised Messiah also constitute a Church. The doctrine, position, walk, and destiny of this Church is interlaced throughout the books of the Old Testament, the Gospel Records of Christ's earthly ministry, the Kingdom Epistles, and Revelation.

While Paul wrote to a Church with a heavenly hope, the rest of the Bible is concerned with a Church whose hope is in God's Kingdom on earth, which the Lord Jesus Christ Himself will one day establish when He returns in great power and glory at His Second Coming. This hope is the main subject of Old Testament Prophecy and is the hope that Peter offered to Israel on Pentecost (Acts 2:15-36 cf. Acts 3:12-26). This Church eventually died out after Israel was set aside in unbelief. But, it will be reestablished after the current Dispensation of Grace comes to a close with the Rapture of the Body of Christ into the heavenlies.

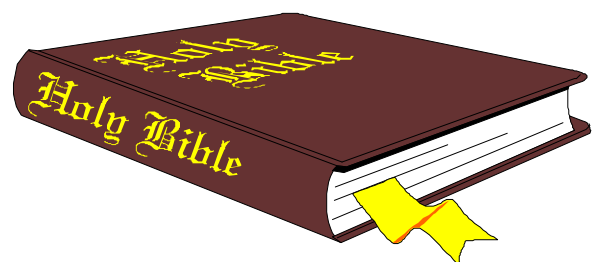
The content of the letters in question deals with the Kingdom Church as it prepares for and goes through the time of the Tribulation that will precede Jesus Christ's return to earth to establish His Kingdom. Hence, our designation of them as the Kingdom Epistles as they look forward to this Kingdom hope of Israel here on the earth.

Just as Paul's letters encourage and instruct us as we wait for our blessed hope, the Rapture, when we will be caught up into heaven, the Kingdom Epistles encourage and instruct those Jewish believers who will find themselves in the Tribulation looking for Christ's return to earth.

While man may make judgments about what he "thinks" or "feels" is the most important, in God's eyes there is no contest, only His revealed truth will do.



## EVANGELISM

Evangelism is the future of the Grace Movement. It is my opinion that if we do not move to an emphasis on personal evangelism, it could mean a slow death of the Grace Movement as we know it.

The need for evangelism in the Dispensation of the Grace of God begins with the words of the Apostle Paul himself in the book of Romans. In Romans 10:14, a very important question is asked – “How shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard?” This question will always lead us back to realizing the importance of evangelism. God is in the people business, and His method is to use people.

America needs more evangelism, and the place to start is at home. We cannot save the world until we save our own house. Every trip starts at home, and every journey starts with a single step. As we look at our own families and those around us, this is a good starting place. Pastor Charles Baker was good at putting things in the proper perspective when he said that “we can’t teach them until we reach them.” If we turn our efforts back to evangelism, and move away from the intellectualism, we will have results and God will bless our efforts.

As Paul himself would go from city to city in the book of Acts, we see a pattern that he used. The first thing that he did was to find an audience to talk to (Acts 14:1). After finding the audience, Paul would move on to the next step which was to tell them about Christ (Acts 16:31). He did not spend a long time before he got to the point of telling them of their need for salvation, and pointing them to Christ. Paul would talk to a lot more people than would become saved. Likewise, we are not going to get everyone to turn to Christ that we talk to. We are not going to get anyone to turn to Christ if we don’t talk to anyone. I am not trying to make evangelism a numbers game, but ten percent of a thousand is still more than zero, which is the number of converts we will see if we do not put the effort forth to talk to people. What we need to do is get going and do something. We need to speak to others, and tell them about Jesus Christ.

In I Tim. 2:3-4, God’s will is explained when Paul tells Timothy that God would like all men to

be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. The fact that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and rose again is **the good news for today**. By simple faith in what Christ has done anyone can have a heavenly hope. This is the message America needs.

## THE WISDOM OF MAN VS. THE WISDOM OF GOD

Proverbs tells us that *“the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge”* (Prov. 1:7). What is in view here is not knowledge for the sake of knowledge. Nor is it the technical knowledge required for carrying out the duties of one’s job or profession. The subject of the Proverbs is the knowledge of God and His ways and how this knowledge is to be incorporated into the individuals day-to-day lifestyle. The Apostle Paul also points out that the knowledge of God is essential to having a life-style that is pleasing to God (see Col. 1:9-10).

When the knowledge of God is correctly applied to a person’s life, it is transformed into “wisdom” which may be referred to as “skill for Godly living.” Engineers, doctors, lawyers, and other professionals must study for years to gain the knowledge to enable them to engage in the practice of their chosen line of work. But it is not until they actually begin putting into practice what they have learned formally that they will become proficient at what they do. And the same is true for the carpenter, electrician, athlete, teacher, banker, cook, salesman, delivery driver, farmer, mechanic, etc., etc. Knowledge about how to do something does no good until one begins doing it. And, if believers are going to demonstrate godliness in their lives,

they must first learn of God and His ways and then seek to live accordingly by putting their knowledge into practice in their *thoughts, words, and actions*.

When we fear something we can flee from it, fight it, or submit to it. Of course, we know that the believer has *“not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba Father”* (Rom 8:15; also see II Tim. 1:7). Being redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ, every believer is made completely acceptable to the Father in His Beloved Son (see Eph. 1:5-7). Being at peace with God (Rom. 5:1), there is no need to fear His judgment. However, it is proper to bow our hearts and lives to Him in appreciation of what Christ has done for us and to express awe and utmost reverence for the magnificence of His very being. This can only be truly demonstrated through submission to His will.

Godly living is successful living, regardless of one’s social status or material wealth. The way of “wisdom” and the way of “foolishness” are contrasted in Proverbs to highlight the benefits of “wisdom living” and explain the consequences of “foolish living,” i.e., living outside of the will of God. In his letter to the Galatians, Paul contrasted these two ways of living as walking in the flesh (foolish living) and walking in the spirit (wisdom living) {see Gal. 5:19-26} Below are some other comparisons from Paul’s Epistles.

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### PRINCIPLES OF FOOLISH LIVING

#### MAN’S WAY

1. Concentrates on exercising power over others (Gal. 4:17).
2. Demands personal rights and freedoms (Rom. 14:15).
3. Generates self-centeredness by asking “what’s in it for me?” (I Tim. 6:5).
4. Lives for the moment by focusing on short term goals that will produce immediate but superficial achievements (II Tim. 3:4).
5. Cultivates the desire to be served by others through exploitation (Gal. 6:12-13; I Tim. 4:1-3; II Tim. 3:6).
6. Determines to push ahead and strive for success by whatever means available to get ahead and be “successful” in the world’s eyes (II Tim. 3:2).
7. Seeks the praise of men (Acts 20:30); by trying to appear Godly through their own power (II Tim. 3:5).

### PRINCIPLES OF WISDOM LIVING

#### GOD’S WAY

1. Concentrates on becoming submissive to God’s will (Rom. 12:1-2; Col. 1:9).
2. Humbly accepts personal responsibilities (I Cor. 10:3-11:1).
3. Generates genuine concern for others by asking “how can I help?” (Phil. 2:5-8; Tit. 3:8).
4. Lives for the future by focusing on long range goals that will produce lasting achievements (I Cor. 3:8-15; Col. 3:1-4).
5. Cultivates the desire to serve others through edification (Rom. 14:19; 15:1-3; Phil. 2:1-4).
6. Recognizes the need to patiently wait on the Lord to open the door of opportunity to be “successful” in God’s eyes (Eph. 6:18-20; Col. 4:2-6).
7. Seeks the approval of God and to glorify Him (I Cor. 10:31; Eph. 5:15-18; Col. 3:23-24).

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think that they are heaven-bound Christians who are not really saved. Anyone who thinks that Jesus Christ was a sinner, denies His resurrection, or does not believe that trusting in Him alone is necessary for salvation, has no idea what the Gospel is. This means that in a lot of churches in this country the Gospel is simply not being preached, the Bible is not defended as God's infallible Word, and sound doctrinal teaching is not taking place.

As Bible believing Christians, how should we respond to such negative reports about what is happening in so many churches in America? I think we should respond with prayer and a desire for God to use us to meet the challenge that we are facing. What is needed is more preachers who will take a stand for the truth of the Gospel of the Grace of God and boldly proclaim "Jesus Christ according to the revelation of the mystery." There is a great need for those who will defend the faith, without compromise, and hold up the Bible as the infallible Word of God that it is.

Just as important is the need for the teaching of the foundational doctrines of Biblical Christianity that provide the basis for all that we believe. To meet these needs there must be men who are prepared to face the challenges of ministering in what some are calling "a post-modern society." A society that is growing increasingly hostile towards those who preach Christ crucified and the Word of God.

Here at **Berean Bible Institute**, we are working hard to equip ministers of the Gospel who can effectively communicate God's Word to the lost and to the saints. We teach our students how to study the Bible for themselves and then have them study the Bible itself rather than just study about the Bible. They are introduced to all sixty-six books of the Bible and taught to read it according to its literal meaning using the proper methods of Bible interpretation. The Bible is taught dispensationally and is held up as the living, powerful, and innerrant Word of God.

We go beyond simply imparting academic knowledge at **BBI** and seek to reach the heart and mind by helping our students to recognize the hand of God at work in their lives on a day-to-day basis. The more they learn to believe and trust God the more their lives and ministry will be Spirit-empowered.
